Animals Including Humans

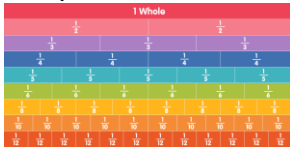
Children will the importance for humans of exercise, eating the right amounts of different types of food, and hygiene.

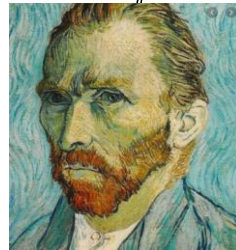

Phonics

Phonics will follow the Jolly Phonics scheme that we have embedded throughout school.

Targeted interventions are continuously evaluated for those children who require additional support with their phonics.



English

Recount of the Florence Nightingale story. Chn will use questioning and discussion to illuminate issues and deepen their understanding through role play. Children will explore and investigate key texts focusing on both reading and writing.

Chn will write a diary entry as if they were Florence Nightingale, they will write a postcard and complete a recount of the main text.

Technical vocabulary about Nursing/Florence Nightingale.

Each day, we set aside time for stories from our the Pie Corbett Reading Spine to develop our understanding of the text and reading skills. All children have daily Lexia interventions which help improve their decoding, reading and comprehension skills.

At home, children can access their reading books on Rising Stars matched to their phonic ability.

This term we have a whole school reading challenge. Children who need more focused reading sessions will receive this during their targeted intervention.
