Literacy

Drama: Children will impersonate pirates to understand their way of living to help with all areas of writing. Children will perform class assemblies around the topic.

Instructions: As we move through the topic children will write a set of instructions linked to a treasure map as if they were a pirate using key words and new vocabulary. They will include directional language in their writing.

Narrative:

Children will write stories in role using their learning about pirates over the weeks. They will use appropriate language and think about what they need to do to interest the writer.

SPAG

On-going SPAG lessons linking to topic where appropriate. Children will learn spellings rules which will link to their weekly spelling tests.

Factual Writing:

Children will write about facts they have learnt. Writing will be linked to SPAG and what they are learning that week will form part of the success criteria.

Diaries: As we move through the topic children will write diary entries as if they were a pirate using key words and new vocabulary. They will include thought and emotions in their writing.
