



In 2025-2026 we received £16,943 P.E. and School Sport Funding. We spent the amount in the following ways:

Amount	What we did	Why did we plan this?
£7780	Used curriculum time gained by shortening the lunch hour to allow the delivery of enrichment clubs to all pupils.	By using the time gained from shortening the lunch hour, the school was able to schedule daily or weekly enrichment clubs during the school day, ensuring that every pupil had structured opportunities to be physically active — especially those who may not attend after-school activities. Delivering enrichment clubs during school hours allows for a wider variety of sports which may not fit into a traditional PE curriculum. It also allowed greater competition to those pupils who desired this and the opportunity of mixed age groups to develop older pupils as role models. Pupils are exposed to new experiences, increasing engagement and participation, particularly from those less interested in mainstream sports. Not all pupils can attend after-school clubs due to transport, family commitments, or cost. Delivering enrichment activities during curriculum time ensures equitable access for all, including pupils eligible for pupil premium and those with SEND. To Raise the Profile of Sport and Physical Activity Across the School (DfE Indicator 2) Replacing part of the lunch break with purposeful, structured activity has improved focus, reduced behavioural incidents during unstructured time, and helped regulate energy levels before afternoon lessons. It promotes mental wellbeing through movement, teamwork, and enjoyment.
£3890	Provided an extra member of staff at lunch times to encourage active play and physical movement.	To contribute to the offer of 30 'active minutes' per day. To ensure provision for physical and mental well-being. To highlight the link between physical and mental well being for pupils. To make better use of zoning of active area encouraging a range of activities including team games, dance, skipping, cycling/scooters.
£1225	Purchase new lunchtime equipment and storage for this to allow a range of activities at lunchtime to increase physical activity for all pupils	

£2400	Subsidise the annual Y4 adventurous activity residential trip.	As a school we feel it is essential to broaden our pupils' horizons and remove barriers to ensure that all of them have equality of opportunity. To develop their resilience and ability to work as a team.
£1200	Continued purchase of the Get Set 4 PE learning platform.	Provides online CPD for staff to increase their confidence in delivering the curriculum. Clearly structures the curriculum to ensure wide coverage of all required elements and a variety of experiences for pupils.
£700	Additional Swimming Lessons	As part of our commitment to ensuring as many pupils as possible of pupils are confident swimmers we deliver in excess of minimum recommended 25hrs of tuition. Being so close to both the sea and several large lakes we feel this is imperative. We intend to review this spending further next year with our first Year 6 cohort.
