

Literacy

Phonics - we are teaching the Jolly Phonic sounds with an additional focus on blending sounds to read words.

Talk for Writing - 'Pardon said the giraffe' and 'The Gruffalo' are our core books this term. We will develop our vocabulary, predict key events, ask questions, follow instructions and sequence.

Stories - we will listen to and talk about a variety of stories from the Pie Corbett Reading Spine.

Physical Development

Through our weekly GetSet4PE we will develop a range of ways to move and balance.

Fine & Gross Motor Skills - we will have many opportunities to develop our finer movement through playdough, paint, tracing, colouring, tweezers, threading, pencil control and cutting. Our balancing, hopping, skipping, running and climbing skills will be developed in the outdoor environment and apparatus lessons.

Understanding the World

We will use pictures and books to show how life was different in the past and understand the past is made of events that has already happened.

In addition, we will discuss our history and all the events that have happened in our lives. We will put familiar events in chronological order on a simple timeline using pictures and discussion, and begin to describe a sequence of real or fictional events, using words such as 'first' or 'then'.

Number and Place Value Numbers to 5

Phonics

We will investigate how numbers are represented in a variety of ways before moving onto identifying the odd one out, putting representations in order and identifying how many are left over.

We will use various number stories to aid our learning such as;



- Three Blind Mice
- Three Little Pigs
- Two Little Blackbirds

Expressive Arts & Design

We will listen to a

variety of music, rhymes and songs, paying attention to how they sound and sharing their opinions. In addition, we will explore a variety of musical instruments.

We will design transient art faces with loose parts. In addition, we will represent different parts of the human body from observation, imagination or memory with attention to some detail.

Continuous Provision

A variety of resources are provided both in the classroom and outside for children to creatively interact with. Continuous provision encourages the children to enhance previously taught concepts and make connections independently.
